Blyth Town Centre Conservation Areas

The Heritage Conservation Area includes numbers 1-17 Bath Terrace, the High Light, St. Cuthbert's Church and Hall, Plessey First School, the Police Station and houses and the

Magistrates' Court, numbers 30 and 32 Ridley Street, 65-91 and 99 (odd) and 28-66 (even) Bridge Street, 1-3 (odd) Percy Street.

The areas are defined on plans which may be inspected at the Council Offices at Seaforth Street, Blyth, and at Avenue Road, Seaton Delaval.

The effect of the designation of the areas as Conservation Areas will be that no person may, without the written consent of the Council, demolish any building or cut down, top, lop, up-root or wilfully damage or destroy any tree within the Conservation Area. Offences against these provisions may result in heavy fines.

Anyone failing to maintain in a proper state of repair any unoccupied listed building, or in certain circumstances an unoccupied unlisted building, is liable for any costs incurred by the local planning authority in carrying out urgent repairs under the terms of section 101 of the 1971 Act.

The Council will also give special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the designated areas both in works initiated by the Council and in making decisions on applications for planning permission within or materially affecting the designated areas.
