**CASTLE MORPETH BOROUGH COUNCIL**

*Conservation Area at Cambo*

Notice is hereby given that the Castle Morpeth Borough Council after consultation with the Northumberland County Council have determined that the area described in the Schedule to this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and have accordingly designated the said area as a Conservation area. The effect of the designation of the conservation area is that when an application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the conservation area is made to the Council and either the development will, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the conservation area or the development is of a kind specified by the Secretary of State, the application will be subject to the special procedure in Section 28 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

A map of the conservation area may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the Planning Officer, Council Offices, Ponteland or at the office of the Chief Executive, Council Offices, Dacre Street, Morpeth.

**SCHEDULE**

The conservation area includes the whole of Cambo village and its adjacent woodland. The northern boundary is defined by the northern side of the B.6343 road extending from its junction with the B.6342 in an easterly direction to a point north of the Holy Trinity Church. Thence the boundary follows the eastern side of the church ground and field boundaries in a southerly direction, thence turning west to follow the southern boundary of the garden areas opposite Front Row. The southern boundary continues across the B.6342 road in a westerly direction for some 250 feet. Thence the boundary continues in a northerly direction adjacent to the west side of an area of woodland. Thereafter it continues in a north-easterly and easterly direction to rejoin the B.6342 road north of the Smithy. Thence the boundary follows the west side of the B.6342 as far as the B.6342 and B.6343 road junction. (832)

*Hambleton District Council Public Path Stopping Up Order (Thornton-le-Street) (No. 1) 1975*

Notice is hereby given that on 25th May 1975, the Hambleton District Council confirmed the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed without modification, is to extinguish a footpath situate within the parish of Thornton-le-Street in the district of Hambleton, namely the public footpath which runs from a point approximately 550 feet from the south-west corner and along the southern boundary of O.S. Field No. 59 to a point approximately 45 feet from the north-eastern boundary of O.S. Field No. 59 adjacent to the "Corn Mill" shown on Ordnance Survey Map, Sheet No. 87/13 (1912 Edition), and create an alternative public footpath in lieu; the new route runs from a point approximately 550 feet from the south-west corner and along the southern boundary of O.S. Field No. 59 at the head of the village and then to a point approximately 350 feet north westwards along a track marked "supposed

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ROMAN ROAD" and then continuing along the original route as aforesaid.
