

North-eastern side, from a point 155 metres north-west of its junction with the Class II (B6255) west of Ingleton to Hawes County Road known as Uppergate, north-westwards for a distance of 45 metres.

*Main Street*, Class III (C385) High Bentham to Ingleton County Road, south-eastern side, from a point 52 metres south-west of its junction with the unclassified County Road known locally as Bell Horse Gate, north-eastwards to its junction with the unclassified County Road known as Bell Horse Gate.

*Main Street*, unclassified County Road, south-eastern side, from its junction with the unclassified County Road known as Bell Horse Gate, north-eastwards for a distance of 22 metres.

## PART II

*Waiting Prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Good Friday to 30th September*

*Main Street* (C385) High Bentham to Ingleton County Road

North-western side, from its point of bifurcation with The Rake north-eastwards to its junction with the unclassified County Road known as Main Street, a distance of 100 metres.

South-eastern side, from a point 90 metres south-west of its junction with the unclassified County Road known as Bell Horse Gate north-eastwards for a distance of 38 metres.

*Main Street*, unclassified County Road

South-eastern side, from a point 22 metres north-east of its junction with the unclassified County Road known as Bell Horse Gate north-eastwards for a distance of 66 metres.

North-western side, from its junction with the unclassified County Road known as Bell Horse Gate, north-eastwards for a distance of 65 metres.

*Bell Horse Gate*, unclassified County Road, northern side, from its junction with the unclassified County Road known as Main Street south-westwards for a distance of 15 metres.

*Seed Hill*, unclassified County Road

North-eastern side, from its junction with the Class II (B6255) west of Ingleton to Hawes County Road known as Uppergate, north-westwards for a distance of 155 metres.

South-western side, from its junction with the Class II (B6255) west of Ingleton to Hawes County Road known as Uppergate, north-westwards for a distance of 60 metres.

A copy of the Order, which comes into operation on 4th November 1985 and continues in force for a period of 12 months, together with a map showing the roads affected, may be inspected at County Hall, Northallerton, and at North Yorkshire County Council Divisional Office, Backgate, Ingleton, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of 24th October 1985, make application to the High Court for the purpose.

#### *Felton Conservation Area*

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of their powers under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, Alnwick District Council hereby designate as a

Conservation Area for the purposes of the said Act all that area of land in the District of Alnwick described in the Schedule hereto.

### SCHEDULE

#### *Description of Felton Area in the District of Alnwick*

Commencing at the centre line of the river south of Felton Mill House the boundary runs north and east to enclose the grounds of Felton Mill, then turns north to cross a track before turning north-east and north to include the housing development and sawmill. The boundary turns east crossing the roadway and follows the northern and eastern boundary of the church and former vicarage before turning north and east to include the houses contained in O.S. field 2830. The boundary turns north again and follows the western side of the B6345 to a point approximately mid-way between Gas Works Farm and Cowslip Hill. It turns north-east following field boundaries across the Back Burn until reaching the boundary of 71 Main Street where it again turns north to include the properties 71 to 83 Main Street. It then follows the western side of Main Street in a northerly direction and encompasses the police station before crossing Main Street. The boundary continued east and south including the grounds of 96 Main Street and crosses Mouldshaugh Lane before again turning east and following the southern boundary of Mouldshaugh Lane beyond the Primary School. It then turns south to the river. At the river the boundary follows the centre line of the river westward to the starting point at Felton Mill.

#### *Newton on the Moor Conservation Area*

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of their powers under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, Alnwick District Council hereby designate as a Conservation Area for the purposes of the said Act all that area of land in the District of Alnwick described in the Schedule hereto.

### SCHEDULE

#### *Description of Boundary of Newton on the Moor Conservation Area in the District of Alnwick*

Commencing at the south-western corner of the property known as "Gilpin" Newton on the Moor the boundary runs north, east, north and east again to include all the dwellings and grounds on the north side of the village before crossing the C97 county road east of Sycamore Syde. The boundary turns south and then east following the line of the public footpath crossing O.S. field 3458 to its junction with the A1 Trunk Road. The boundary then turns south following the western edge of the highway to the north-eastern corner of O.S. field 4100 before turning west and following the northern field boundary to the C97 county road. It crosses the road and follows the western highway boundary northwards as far as the garden area of a property known as the Square where it turns west to include this property and the northern half of O.S. field 0720. It then runs north and north-west following the boundary of the former quarry to the property known as the Old School House. The boundary then encloses the Old School House before crossing along its southern and western boundary before continuing across the C106 county road and turning east to the starting point.
