

YORK CITY COUNCIL

The City of York (Various Streets) (Restriction of Waiting and Driving) Order 1984

Notice is hereby given that the York City Council, pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the North Yorkshire County Council in exercise of the County Council's powers under sections 1, 9 and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, intend to make an Order the effect of which will be:

- (a) to introduce 24-hour no waiting (subject to the usual exemptions) in:
 - (i) *Gladstone Street* on its north-east side, and
 - (ii) *Wigginton Road* on its east side from a point 85 metres to the south of its junction with Fountayne Street for a distance of 170 metres in a southerly direction;
- (b) to introduce no waiting 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday (subject to the usual exemptions) on the south-west sides of *Penley's Grove Street* and *Townend Street* other than those parts which are already subject to 24-hour no waiting restrictions;
- (c) to prohibit vehicles, other than pedal cycles, from proceeding over *Eastern Terrace* between its junctions with the southern side of *Wood Street* and the northern side of the rear access road to numbers 69-77 (odd) *East Parade*. The prohibition, which will if finally approved be introduced for an initial 6-month experimental period, will be given effect by the erection of bollards at a point in *Eastern Terrace* 27 metres south of its junction with the southern kerb-line of *Wood Street*;
- (d) to prohibit vehicles from proceeding over *Church Lane* off *Low Ousegate*, and its associated footpaths, except for the purposes of loading/unloading, emergency services, the statutory undertakers, and building etc. works;
- (e) in connection with the *Sainsbury Development* off *Foss Bank* to make a length of *Foss Bank* from its junction with *Monkbridge* roundabout two-way.

A copy of the draft Order, statements of the reasons for making it and maps showing the lengths of road affected may be seen at my office during normal business hours.

Objections to the proposals should be sent to me in writing by 29th March 1984 and should specify the grounds on which they are made.

WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Calderdale) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 3) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan Council have made the above Order under their powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting by vehicles at any time on lengths of *High Level Way* and on *Queens Road* (west side) at its junction with *High Level Way* at *Halifax*.

A copy of the Order, which comes into force on 11th April 1984, together with a map showing the restricted roads may be examined during normal working hours at the Reception Desk at the main entrance to the County Hall, Wakefield and at the County Council's Offices at *Powell Street, Halifax*.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date upon which the Order was made (i.e. 28th February 1984), apply to the High Court for this purpose.

WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council have made the under-mentioned Orders under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effects of which in relation to roads at *Chapel Allerton, Leeds*:

- (1) *The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Leeds) (Parking Place) (No. 6) Order 1982.*

To create a parking place for police vehicles on the south side of *Town Street* from 5 metres east of *Harrogate Road* for 58 metres eastwards.

- (2) *The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Leeds) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 27) Order 1982.*

This proposal prohibits all vehicles except buses from stopping or waiting between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day at any bus stop within the length of *Harrogate Road* between *Ingle Row* and *Woodland Lane* where the carriageway at the stop is marked "Bus Stop" with a broad yellow line adjacent to the edge of the carriageway (the authorised markings). These restrictions can apply to any bus stop within that length provided that the authorised markings are in evidence.

- (3) *The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Leeds) (Traffic Regulation) (No. 5) Order 1982:*

(a) To prohibit waiting by vehicles at all times in lengths of *Allerton House Access Road*, *Harrogate Road*, *Hawthorn Road*, *Regent Street*, *Town Street*, *Victoria Street*, *Woodland Lane* and *Well Lane*.

(b) To limit waiting to 1 hour (return prohibited within 1 hour) between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in a length of *Stainbeck Lane*;

(c) To prohibit the use by motor vehicles (with certain exceptions including an exception to allow access to adjacent premises) in lengths of *Victoria Street* and *Short Lane*.

(d) To impose one-way working on part of *Stainbeck Lane* on the north west side of the island at the *Harrogate Road* junction in a direction towards *Harrogate Road*.

A copy of the Orders which come into force on 2nd April 1984 together with a map showing the restricted roads may be examined during normal working hours at the Reception Desk, at the main entrance to the County Hall, Wakefield, and at the County Council's Leeds Traffic Unit, 5th Floor East, Merriam House, Merriam Way, Leeds.

If you wish to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirements of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, you may within 6 weeks from the date upon which the Orders were made (i.e. 28th February 1984) apply to the High Court for this purpose.
