#### SCHEDULE

Description of Conservation Areas in the Borough of Castle Morpeth, Belsay

Commencing at the north-western corner of Village Wood at the A696 trunk road, the boundary proceeds generally southwards and eastwards along the western boundary of Village Wood to the Smithy at the southern end of Belsay Village. The boundary then proceeds along the southern boundary of Smithy House to the south-eastern corner of the garden of Woodbine Cottage. It then proceeds in a north-north-westerly direction directly across the fields to the east of Belsay Village to the eastern boundaries of Ivy Cottage and Sweet Briar Cottage. It then proceeds westwards along the northern boundaries of Sweet Briar Cottage and Bank House to the western side of the C156, Belsay to Bolam Road. The boundary then proceeds along the eastern and northern sides of the wood lying between the C156 and A696 roads and along the southern side of the A696 trunk road to the north-western corner of Village Wood.

### Capheaton

Commencing at the south-eastern corner of the grounds of the West Lodge, to Capheaton Hall, the boundary proceeds northwards and westwards around the grounds of Orchard House to the C.338 and southwards down the west side of the road. It then proceeds westwards along the northern boundaries of the cottages facing the C.338 and U.9005 roads to the western side of The Dovecote. The boundary then crosses to the south side of the U.9005 and proceeds eastwards along the southern side of this road, and along the southern side of the C.338 and drive to Capheaton House to the southern boundary of the West Lodge to Capheaton Hall.

## High Callerton

The boundary then crosses East Road in a northerly direction and proceeds westwards along the southern boundary of Normandy Terrace and the northern boundaries of properties Normandy Terrace and the northern boundaries of properties from Stonehaven to the Longhorsley Mission Field. It then proceeds southwards along the eastern boundary of the Bungalows and westwards along the northern side of East Road to the A.697.
