##### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

*The County of Northampton (Parish of Yardley Gobion—Footpaths SH.21 and SH.19) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 20th October 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Northamptonshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert lengths of public footpaths SH.21 and SH.19 in the Parish of Yardley Gobion which run through the grounds of Rudolf Steiner School, Potterspury Lodge, to a line slightly to the north of the existing paths.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Clerk to the Towcester Rural District Council, Town Hall, Towcester, and at my office and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Northampton, not later than the 20th November 1972, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

From this point it runs in a south-westerly direction to the south of Armstrong House and the properties on the south side of

Front Street, and connects up with the lane in front of South Victoria Terrace. It then runs northwards up Ingram Road and turns south-west along the Lucker Road, from which it turns northwards to the west of the Grace Darling Museum, crosses the Radcliffe Road and continues northwards to the west of St. Aidans Church. The boundary then runs in a mainly north-easterly direction to the north of the church and Bamburgh Hall Farm, crosses The Wynding and so back to the northern perimeter of The Castle.
