Melanie Lindsley Development Team Leader, Planning	Coal Authority	The Coal Authority states that its records do not indicate that the Neighbourhood Plan area contains any recorded risks from past coal mining activity at shallow depth. On this basis it has no specific comments to make on the Neighbourhood Plan.
Paul Dixon Planning & Development Yorkshire & North East	Highways England	Highways England provided a response to the Parish Council in February 2020 and having reviewed the supporting information does not wish to offer further comment. Its previous comments on the Craster Neighbourhood Plan are withstanding.
