Cramlington Town Council was identified as the lead organisation to develop a neighbourhood plan as part of the government's final call for the neighbourhood planning pilot programme – the 'Front Runners'. Cramlington south west sector was initially proposed as the area for which a neighbourhood plan could usefully be prepared as a means of finalising the longstanding expectation to complete this New Town by expanding to the south west.

In 2012, Planning Aid England ran a visioning workshop with Cramlington Town Council which identified a range of issues beyond the south west sector. Subsequently, the Town Council agreed that the plan area should cover the whole of the parish giving an opportunity to bring together all associated service and infrastructure providers to plan future development of the town, but having an initial focus on the south west sector. The Town Council understand that it is normally accepted as appropriate for neighbourhood plan areas to be designated by reference to civil parish areas. Cramlington has been identified in consecutive planning policy documents as Northumberland's sub-regional focus for employment and housing development. With regard to this position the Town Council considers it appropriate to prepare up-to-date locally relevant planning policies to deal with applications for development within the parish.

Cramlington Town Council is an active and very capable Town Council, who are committed and wish to promote and shape the delivery of planned growth in and around the town.

I can confirm that **CRAMLINGTON TOWN COUNCIL** is a relevant body for the purpose of neighbourhood planning in accordance with section 61G of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
