Sara Frisby	Northumberland Wildlife Trust	<p>The Plan shows that the Hauxley community obviously values its natural heritage. Nature conservation is at the forefront of the plan and NWT applaud this.</p> <p>Suggest the inclusion of 'protecting local ecosystem services' within Objective 3 (section 3.2, page 12). The natural coastal dune system provides the equivalent of millions of pounds worth of sea defence, a vital service to the local population.</p> <p>Support the definition of Local Green Spaces and that they do not need to be accessible. Also support the retention of valuable wildlife corridors and coastal habitats.</p>
Planning Technical Team	Sport England	<p>Standing advice provided relating to sources of information, guidance and requirements set out in national policy.</p> <p>No specific comments to make.</p>
Melanie Lindsley	Coal Authority	<p>There are recorded coal mining features present at surface and shallow depth including: mine entries, coal workings and coal extraction by surface mining methods. These recorded features may pose a potential risk to surface stability and public safety.</p> <p>However, the Neighbourhood Plan does not propose to allocate any new sites for future development. On this basis the Coal Authority have no specific comments to make on this document.</p>
Sally Wintle	Natural England	<p>Standing advice provided relating to sources of information, guidance and requirements set out in national policy.</p> <p>No specific comments to make.</p>
J Stewart		<p>Fully supportive of the proposals made within the Plan.</p> <p>The Neighbourhood Plan will support the sustainability of the parish and the villages within it, whilst also retaining its rural nature and protecting the natural habitats and wildlife that are supported within it.</p>

Jules Brown	Historic England	No comment to make on the detail of the plan.
Sarah Brannigan	Northumberland County Council	Recommendations for the correction of typographical errors and amendments to supporting text. Did not consider that sufficient evidence had been provided to justify the inclusion of Green Gaps within Policy H3. Minor suggested changes to policies and policies map to improve clarity and remove ambiguity.
