### Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 Regulation (Regulation 7)

#### DECISION REGARDING APPLICATION FOR DESIGNATION OF THE PARISHES OF ANCROFT, DUDDO, HOLY ISLAND, HORNCLIFFE, KYLOE, NORHAM, ORD AND SHORESWOOD AS A NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA

In accordance with Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (Regulation 7) Northumberland County Council hereby gives notice on the designation of the Civil Parishes of Ancroft, Duddo, Holy Island, Horncliffe, Kyloe, Norham, Ord and Shoreswood as the 'Norham and Islandshire Neighbourhood Area' for the purposes of neighbourhood planning under Section 61G(1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended. The designated area is shown on the attached map.

Under Section 61H(1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended, the area has not been designated as a business neighbourhood area because it is not wholly or primarily business in nature. The relevant designation information is set out below:
