

## Notice of making of a Public Spaces Protection Order for the control of dogs

## Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, Part 4

## TAKE NOTICE that:

- 1 **Northumberland County Council** (*"the Council"*) has carried out the necessary consultation on its proposal to make **The Northumberland County Council (Dog Control) Public Spaces Protection Order** (*"the PSPO"*) in accordance with section 72 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 ("the Act").
- 2 The PSPO has now been made in accordance with section 59 of the Act and it comes into force on **31**<sup>st</sup> **January 2020**.

- 4 Under the provisions of section 66 of the Act an interested person may apply to the High Court **within 6 weeks** from the date that the PSPO is made to question its validity on the grounds that:
  - (a) the Council did not have the power to make the PSPO, or to include particular prohibitions or requirements imposed by it; or
  - (b) that a requirement of Part 4, Chapter 2 of the Act was not complied with in relation to the PSPO.
- 5 An *'interested person'* is defined by section 66(2) of the Act as being an individual who lives in the restricted area or who regularly works in or visits that area.
