Fun Whatever the Weather at Whitehouse Farm Centre

Looking for something to fill a dodgy weather day? Why not combine a bus ride with a trip to Whitehouse Farm Centre for a fun-filled family day out?

Whitehouse Farm Centre is Northumberland's largest family run Farm attraction! www.whitehousefarmcentre.co.uk. Here visitors of all ages get to see, handle and feed a wide variety of animals from traditional breeds to more unusual and exotic species.

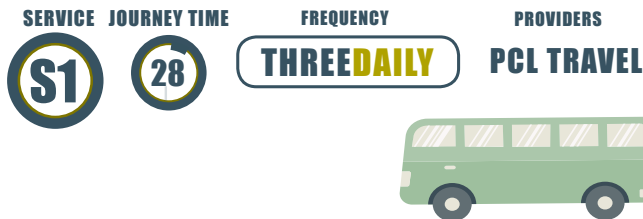
There is always a full programme of hands on activities from meeting mini beasts & reptiles, hugging a bunny, stroking anything from a snake to a skunk, being mesmerised by meerkats & marmosets to having a hoot with the Owls! With both indoor and outdoor play areas there is something to do whatever the weather!

The centre is open every day during the main season and school holidays, and open Tuesday to Sunday at other times. Closed during January and part of November.

The S1 bus runs a regular service, Monday-Saturday from Morpeth Bus Station. The journey takes just under 30 minutes, plenty of time for little explorers to enjoy a game of I-Spy.

Once the kids have had a chance to run free-range, make sure you head to the Whitehouse Farm Kitchen to sample some freshly made, locally sourced provisions. After running off some energy return home on the S1 service with your tired but happy little travellers.

DAY OUT TWO

No Ordinary Victorian Adventure

The Victorians loved exploring and going on expeditions, so why not take your mini-adventurers on a grand expedition to the Victorian Cragside House? www.nationaltrust.org/cragside.

The M1 and X14 run regular services Monday to Saturday from Morpeth Bus Station through to Rothbury Town Centre. From here you can catch the 15 service from the Queens Head, for the five minute journey to Cragside. Cragside is no ordinary National Trust property. Home to Lord Armstrong, a Victorian inventor, the house was once described as 'a palace of the modern magician'. You can use the children's trail around the house to uncover a wealth of ingenious gadgetry.

The fun doesn't stop there. The grounds of the Cragside Estate are great for keeping little explorers occupied. There are lakes, woodland, a play area, labyrinth, and the trim trail, where the whole family can test their agility. The estate features 40 miles of footpaths and way-marked walks with routes that are pushchair friendly. In wet weather you can head to the Young Engineers' Zone and inspire little inventors or visit the power house which has interactive models enabling children to experiment with hydroelectricity. Hungry adventurers can refuel with a kid's lunch pack in the tea-rooms, and the shop offers perfect pocket-money treats. Cragside is open year-round. Please check the website for specific opening times and details.
