PROPOSED TOUCAN CROSSINGS A193 ROTARY WAY / B1329 LINKS ROAD, BLYTH

Purpose of Report

To consider the results of the public consultation exercise, regarding the provision of a Toucan Crossing on the A193 Rotary Way and B1329 Links Road, Blyth (see attached Consultation Plan in Appendix A).

Recommendations

It is recommended that:

Given the outcome of the consultation as well as the comments received it is recommended that the proposals to provide a Toucan Crossing on the A193 Rotary Way and B1329 Links Road, Blyth should proceed.

Key Issues

1) Following continued road safety concerns from adjacent schools and parents, residents and other interested organisations were consulted on proposed Toucan crossings.

PROPOSED TOUCAN CROSSINGS A193 ROTARY WAY / B1329 LINKS ROAD, BLYTH

Background

Introduction

- 1. Concerns have been expressed by residents of South Beach and South Shore estates regarding the safe crossing for pedestrians on Rotary Way and Links Road, Blyth. A PV2 survey was carried out for both locations in 2011 and the results figures were 0.9 for Rotary Way and 0.5 for the links Road, which is above the County Councils figure of 0.2 to investigate further.
- The request for a controlled crossing was placed on the Register of requests and was put forward as a priority for the 2013 / 2014 Minor Improvements Program (LTP).
- 3. The proposed scheme is also part of the local cycle way development, and Toucan Crossing facilities are being proposed which will aid both pedestrians and cyclists crossing these busy roads.

Consultation

- **4.** A scheme was prepared and was the subject of a consultation, which concluded 15th August 2013.
- 5. The consultation exercise involved the delivery of a consultation letter together with a plan showing details of the scheme to approximately 343 adjacent households, statutory consultees; County Councillor D Campbell, Blyth Town Council; road user organisations; and other interested parties. A plan showing the scheme is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).
- 6. Responses were received from 48 consultees with 41 being in favour and 7 against.
- 7. There was 1 statutory consultee that responded, The North East Ambulance Service recognised and appreciated the need for restrictions to improve road safety and supported the proposals.
- 8. Forty of the residents are in favour of the proposals and the general opinion is that the crossings are a good idea and will improve road safety for the public. Other comments indicated that the proposals are sensible and will allow people to have a safer access to beach and local estates.
- 9. Several residents objected to the proposals for the following reasons; The bus shelter will interrupt their coastal views, the crossing on the Links road is in the wrong location, it should be located where the existing uncontrolled crossing point is, the crossings are situated too close to the roundabout and will cause traffic jams, disappointed at proposed locations of crossings as in their opinion they are in dangerous places, the proposed bus stop location will make it dangerous for pedestrians to cross at existing uncontrolled crossing

point and generally that the crossings are not in the right locations for residents of South Shore.

Conclusion

- 10. From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concern over road safety in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. The assessment of the results in the consultation exercise can be a contentious matter, but experience has shown that when levels of opposition are much above 30% those opposed to the scheme can engender support from neighbours, which can create difficulties in implementing the scheme. The consultation exercise showed that overall 15% of all consultees who responded were against the proposals.
- 12. It is recommended that, in view of the results of the consultation exercise, the scheme to provide Toucan crossing facilities should proceed.

Rotary Way / Links Road, Blyth Proposed Toucan Crossings

Following road safety concerns at the above locations, the County Council is considering introducing two Toucan Crossing facilities.

Pedestrian/Vehicle surveys have been undertaken and the results of this have indicated that a signal controlled crossing would be justified at both locations. A Toucan Crossing would of course allow pedestrians / cyclists to cross the road "on demand" by pressing a button and this arrangement would afford greater priority for pedestrians / cyclists.

Toucan crossings aim to improve safety and reduce delays. A Toucan crossing is similar to a pelican crossing, but has sensors which can both allow pedestrians / cyclists longer to cross the road or return the signals to green if the button is pressed and no pedestrians actually cross the road.

The County Council is seeking your views on the proposals shown overleaf and a freepost response form is attached to facilitate the consultation process. It should be stressed that this is a genuine consultation and that comments received will be carefully considered.

Regrettably, it is not possible to reply to individual comments but you may wish to note that comments may be included in a report, to the Corporate Director of Local Services.





			×					In relation to the enclosed proposals, I have viewed the included plans and I do not support them. To be specific it is not the idea of the crossings I am opposed to, it is their suggested location. The proposed crossings on the Links Road and Rotary Way would be placed too close to the roundabout. When active, traffic will build up onto the roundabout, blocking exit from and entry to the roundabout. This jamming traffic on the roundabout itself will lead to an increase in road traffic collisions. I would suggest the crossings are placed further north on both the Links Road and Rotary Way. Firstly on Rotary Way there is a traffic Island around 100 yards north of the proposed site. This is very close to the main pathway into the estate and so, it is where most people cross the road anyway. Could this traffic island not be converted to the proposed crossing as it would be much more beneficial at this location. Secondly on the Links Road, again around 100 yards north of the proposed location there is the main testate entrance on one side of the road and on the other is the main beach access lane. This again is where most people cross the road. A crossing at this location would be far more beneficial.
