# PROPOSED SPEED LIMIT ALTERATIONS VARIOUS LOCATIONS IN NORTHUMBERLAND

### **Purpose of Report**

To consider the introduction of new 30 mph speed limits, 40 mph speed limits and extended 30 mph speed limits on various roads throughout the County.

### Recommendations

### It is recommended that:

Given the outcome of the consultation as well as the comments received it is recommended that the proposed Speed Limit Alterations should proceed.

### **Key Issues**

1) As part of this current years LTP minor improvements, schemes based on the County Council's policy for the introduction of lower speed limits were prepared and consulted on. More detailed information on the proposal is contained on the plan attached in Appendix 1.

### **Background**

### Introduction

The County Council receives a large number of requests for the introduction
of road safety measures reflecting a widespread concern over traffic speeds.
Many of these requests relate to speed limits, and as part of the current
year's programme of Minor Improvement Schemes the site listed below were
identified as potential locations for the introduction of amended speed limits;

C272 & C273 Broomley Village – 30 mph Speed Limit
A193 Bebside – 30 mph Extension
C127 Longhirst Village – 30 mph Extension
B6320 & C199 Bellingham - 30mph extension & a 40mph speed limit
C390 Swarland
A695 Farnley – 40 mph Speed Limit
A1068 Hartford Bridge – 40 mph Speed Limit

### Consultation

- 2. Statutory consultation with the emergency services, road user groups and local councils has been carried out. The Executive Member for Highways and Transport and the appropriate local Members have also been consulted.
- 3. 10 responses were received to the consultation exercise with no objections to the speed limit amendments apart from Bellingham Parish Council who objected to the proposed 40 mph speed limit, and requested that this be changed to 30 mph speed limit.
- 4. Alternative speed limit proposals for Bellingham were initially considered at the Planning and Environment committee in October 2011. The initial proposal, as shown in appendix 3, was for the proposed extents to be 30 mph and not part 30 and 40 mph as shown in appendix 1. In response to questions from Members regarding the necessity of extending the 30 mph limit in a southern direction to The Croft at Bellingham, it was stated that due to the sight lines, it was considered signs could be not erected nearer to the south side of the bridge and therefore the scheme had been extended. Due to the precedent which would be set if the scheme at Bellingham was accepted, after discussions Members requested that the scheme at Bellingham be deferred to allow further consideration on the extent of the speed limit alterations.
- 5. Following the comments from members, the proposals have been amended as shown in appendix 1 to extend the 30 mph speed limit around the bend and introduce a 40 mph speed limit on the approach to the 30 mph. Bellingham Parish Council have strongly opposed the proposed 40 mph speed limit and ask the County Council to reconsider making the proposed limits all 30 mph as initially consulted on in 2011.

### Conclusion

- 6. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making a traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.
- 7. Accordingly, it is recommended to proceed with the introduction of the speed limit alterations in Northumberland, apart from the proposed 40 mph and 30 mph speed limit extension on the B6320 & C144 Bellingham.
- 8. The initial 30 mph speed limit proposals for Bellingham as shown in appendix 3 were proposed as the existing site restraints made it difficult to meet current County Council speed limit policy. The verge space available was insufficient to site terminal signs and it would be difficult to meet the necessary visibility requirements locating the 30 mph signs close to the bridge. Current policy for village speed limits requires there be a minimum of 3 houses for every 100 metres throughout the extents of the limit, but it is paramount that these density requirements are met at the start of the limit. Given there are 8 properties at the Croft and then a Church, together with the site constraints, it suggested that the 30 mph speed limit be as shown in appendix 3.
- 9. Given the comments received from Bellingham Parish Council and the difficulties in siting the signs as shown in Appendix 1, it is recommended that the proposals shown in appendix 3 should proceed.
