- 1) Currently access is restricted into some parking places in Dial Place, increasing difficulty in manoeuvring into these marked bays.

PROPOSED 'No Waiting at Any Time Restriction Extension – Dial Place Warkworth'

BACKGROUND

Introduction

- Dial Place is in the centre of Warkworth Village and has a number of unregulated parking places. At a particularly narrow section of Dial Place, some of these parking places have been restricted due to indiscriminate parking adjacent to these marked bays
- 2) By extending the existing the restriction, by some 15 metres, access to these spaces with be greatly improved. Thereby increasing the flow of traffic and thereby increase safety to the road user when manoeuvring into these spaces.

Consultation

- 3) Consultation took place throughout April 2013 with a proposal to extend the existing No waiting at any time restriction in Dial Place as shown on Appendix 1.
- 4) The consultation process involved the delivery of a consultation letter, together with a plan showing the details of the proposals. This was sent out to 39 adjacent households and business premises affected, together with associated statutory bodies. Of those that responded there were no objections and 4 indicated their preference for the scheme, (see Appendix 2)
- 5) The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making a traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.


