# RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES

# PROPOSED REPLACEMENT OF 'LOADING BAY' WITH '20 MINUTE LIMITED WAITING' BAYS, FRONT STREET, NEWBIGGIN-BY-THE-SEA

### Purpose of report:

To consider the results of the public consultation exercise regarding the proposed replacement of the existing Loading Bay sited at Front Street, Newbiggin-by-the-Sea with 20 Minute Limited Waiting Bays, together with the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to enable enforcement.

#### Recommendations:

It is recommended that in view of the consultation exercise the existing loading bay at Front Street, Newbiggin-by-the-Sea should be replaced with '20 Minute Limited Waiting Bays' as proposed.

#### Key issues

- 1) Scheme being funded by Councillor Simpson
- 2) The scheme will promote business turnover in the area
- 3) Supported by Local Councillor, Town Council, and majority of residents and businesses.

# PROPOSED REPLACEMENT OF 'LOADING BAY' WITH '20 MINUTE LIMITED WAITING' BAYS, FRONT STREET, NEWBIGGIN-BY-THE-SEA

#### **BACKGROUND**

- In an attempt to promote business turnover at Front Street, Newbiggin-bythe-Sea, Councillor Simpson has requested Council Officers consider providing '20 minute Limited Waiting' bays in place of the existing loading bay.
- 2) These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise that involved the delivery of a consultation letter to 82 households / business, and approximately 25 statutory consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix 1).

#### CONSULTATION

- 3) The consultation exercise ended on 18 June 2014, and responses were received from 13 consultees, with 11 in favour and 1 against the proposals. One consultee expressed no overall preference. A summary of these responses is attached as Appendix 2.
- 4) North East Ambulance Service was the only statutory consultee who responded to the consultation, indicating no overall preference.

#### IN FAVOUR

- 5) Whilst indicating their support of the proposals on the response form provided, residents also made the following comments:-
  - Similar proposals should be considered at other areas of Newbiggin.
  - Current car parks in Newbiggin should be time restricted to prevent all day parking to further increase business turnover.
  - Residents Permit Scheme is also required.
  - Needs to be monitored to ensure restrictions are adhered to.
- 6) Given these comments, the following requests will be recorded on the County Council's Directory of Requests Database for consideration in a future Local Transport Plan (LTP) Programme.
  - 20 Minute Limited Waiting Bays throughout Front Street and Main Street, Newbiggin-by-the-Sea
  - Time restrictions to be introduced to Car Parks within Newbiggin
  - Residents Permit Scheme at Front Street and Main Street, Newbiggin-by-the Sea.
- 7) Once the new restrictions are in place, we will ensure that Civil Parking Enforcement Officers regularly visit the area as part of their current route.

#### **OBJECTIONS**

8) The one objection received stated that they had never experienced a problem with parking at Front Street and changing the existing Loading Bay to 20 minute Limited Waiting Bays would not promote business in the area.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 9) From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concerns raised in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. Following the consultation exercise it is clear that the majority of residents who have responded are in favour of the proposals. It is envisaged that the introduction of 20 minute Limited Waiting Bays will promote business turnover in the area. It is therefore recommended that the existing loading bay is replaced as proposed.
- 10) The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.
- 11)Accordingly it is recommended that the Committee agree to advise the Corporate Director of Local Services to note the objections but agree to proceed with the introduction of the following Traffic Regulation Order:
  - South East Northumberland Area (Parking Places) Composite Order 2011 Amendment No. 6 Order 2014.


