PROPOSED 30MPH SPEED LIMIT EXTENSION – A197 NEW LEISURE CENTRE, ASHINGTON

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To consider an extension of the existing 30mph speed limit on the A197 New Leisure Centre, Ashington.

RECOMONDATIONS

It is recommended to extend the 30mph speed limit on the A197- Ashington (adjacent to the New Leisure Centre).

KEY ISSUES

- 1) The scheme will be funded by the developer.
- 2) The 30mph speed limit extension has been requested as a planning condition.

<u>PROPOSED 30MPH SPEED LIMIT EXTENSION – A197 NEW LEISURE CENTRE, ASHINGTON</u>

BACKGROUND

- 1. In 2014, planning permission was approved to develop the New Leisure Centre, Ashington. As part of a Road Safety Audit, recommendations were made to extend the existing 30mph speed limit to ensure that the development was within the 30mph speed zone.
- 2. In February 2015, funds were secured from the developer in order to carry out the proposed scheme.

CONSULTATION

- 3. A scheme was prepared and was subject to a consultation which concluded on 6th May 2015.
- 4. The consultation exercise involved 30 statuary consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A). This is also available on our website.
- 5. A total of two responses were received, both in favour of the scheme.

CONCLUSION

6. It is recommended that in view of the results of the consultation exercise, together with the requirement of the Planning Application: To support the scheme to extend the 30mph speed limit along this section of the A197.


