RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES

PROPOSED 20mph SPEED LIMIT AND EXTENSTION OF SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR MARKINGS – STAKEFORD PRIMARY SCHOOL

Background and Key Issues:

- 1) A New County Council initiative is in place to ensure that all schools in the County are governed by a 20mph Speed Limit.
- 2) Concerns have been raised about indiscriminate parking and road safety at Stakeford Primary School at start and finish times. In order to address these issues it is proposed to extend the existing School Keep Clear Road Markings on East Ford Road to ensure that the front of the school, including the new school extension is covered by these restrictions.
- 3) The proposed 20mph Speed Limit and extended School Keep Clear Markings have the support of approval of County Councillor Foster, Choppington Parish Council and the Head Teacher. Their letters of support are attached as Appendix A, B and C.
- 4) East Ford Road in Stakeford is due to be resurfaced during the October half term holidays, and it is proposed to paint the School Keep Clear markings and introduce the 20mph speed limit at the same time on the grounds of efficiency.
- 5) The emergency services have been informed of the proposals, and notices have been displayed on site to inform residents of the intended works. A copy of the notice is attached as Appendix D.
- 6) Due to the legal process attached to making the Traffic Regulation Order (TRO), it is unlikely that the TRO will be in place until late November 2015. The 20mph Speed Limit and School Keep Clear road markings will therefore only be advisory until that time. Any signage which is erected as prior to the TRO being in place will be bagged over.
- 7) In addition, as part of Northumberland County Council's First Response Initiative, Road Safety Officers will be visiting the school to arrange pedestrian training and to encourage behavioural changes in terms of the school run.

As part of an on-going safety initiative by Northumberland County Council, it is proposed to introduce 20 mph zones adjacent to all schools within Northumberland over the next 5 years.

Under the "Go Gently At Twenty" campaign. The following school has been included in the 2015-16 Local Transport Plan programme.

Stakeford Fist School

Details and extent of the new restrictions

The extent of the new restrictions are detailed on the attached plan and include:

- A new 20 mph speed limit on East Ford Road, Ford Park, Ellesmere Gardens, Half Moon Street/Harrington Gardens Back Lane and Half Moon Street/ Ellesmere Gardens Back Lane.
- Extension of existing School Keep Clear makings (yellow zig zag lines) adjacent to Stakeford First School on East Ford Road.

Process and Timescales

A Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) is required to enforce these new and extended restrictions.

The first of the legal notices will be advertised week commencing 26th October 2015 for a three week period. It is anticipated the Order will come into force early December 2015.

Consultation and Feedback

This proposal has support of the County Council, Local Councillors and Head Teacher. Statutory organisations are currently being consulted.
