

# RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING

# Proposal to Remove the Existing No Waiting and Loading at Any Time Restriction (No's 9 to 15) Astley Road, Seaton Delaval

20th July 2016

#### **Purpose of Report**

To consider the results of the public consultation exercise, regarding the proposed removal of the Waiting and Loading restrictions on Astley Road, Seaton Delaval.

#### Recommendations

#### It is recommended that:

• It is recommended that the restrictions are removed on Astley Road in Seaton Delaval: - No Waiting and Loading at any time (Double Yellow Lines).

#### **Key Issues**

- This area has been the subject of parking issues over a period of time and on occasions causing congestion. After reviewing the existing restrictions on Astley Road, it was found that these were no longer relevant and the removal of these restrictions would improve the provision of on street parking.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- 1. Concerns have been identified to Councillor Richards by residents on a number of occasions with regard to the lack of on street parking in the area.
- 2. It is proposed to remove the existing "No Waiting and Loading at Any Time" restriction (Double yellow lines) in this area.
- 3. This will help with the provision of on street parking.

#### CONSULTATION

- 3. These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise, conducted on the 15th April 2016. This involved the delivery of a consultation letter to 9 residents and 25 statutory consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).
- 4. The consultation exercise ended on 13th May 2016 and responses were received from 1 consultees, with 0 in favour, 0 against and 1 neither for nor against the proposal. A summary of the responses is attached as Appendix B.

#### **COMMENTS**

5. Councillor Richards was notified of the results of the consultation and confirms she wishes to proceed with the proposal, which will be funded through her allocation in the Members' Local Improvements Programme.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

6. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.


