

# RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING

## PROPOSED PARKING RESTRICTIONS WELL CLOSE SQUARE, BERWICK

#### **Purpose of Report**

To consider the results of the public consultation exercise, regarding proposed parking restrictions on Well Close Square in Berwick

#### Recommendations

#### It is recommended that:

1. Parking restrictions are introduced on Well Close Square as proposed.

#### **Key Issues**

- 1. Scheme being funded by LTP
- 2. Scheme supported by Councillor Gavin Jones
- 3. Location has been identified as a problem area by Parking Services
- 4. Removes vehicular obstruction from crossing point and entrance to the Berwick Infirmary

#### **BACKGROUND**

1. Concerns have been raised by Parking Services about obstructions at crossing points on Well Close Square. It has been reported that vehicles are parking across the dropped kerb crossing on Well Close Square at its junction with the Berwick Infirmary. This is resulting in obstruction to pedestrians wishing to cross the road at the designated crossing point and vehicles entering the Berwick Infirmary. The introduction of the parking restriction will improve road safety and improve visibility by removing obstruction at the crossing point.

#### **CONSULTATION**

- 2. These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise that involved the delivery of a consultation letter to 15 residents and 30 statutory consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).
- 3. The consultation exercise ended on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2015 and responses were received from 2 consultees, with one in favour and one consultee did not express a preference. A summary of the responses is attached an appendix B.
- 4. The North East Ambulance Service was the only statutory consultee that responded and they did not express a preference.

#### COMMENTS

5. The only comment we received from a resident who was in favour of the proposal stated "Provided it does not have any impact on Hospital services". The new restrictions will improve the access to the hospital by keeping the junction of the hospital and Well Close Square clear.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 6. From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concerns raised in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. The result of the consultation exercise shows that the majority of the residents who responded support the proposals. It is therefore recommended that the proposed parking restrictions be introduced.
- 7. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.

#### Proposed Parking Restrictions - Well Close Square, Berwick

Concerns have been raised by Parking Services about obstructions at crossing points on Well Close Square. It has been reported that vehicles are parking across the dropped kerb crossing point on Well Close Square at its junction with the hospital. This is causing obstruction to pedestrians wishing to cross the road at the designated crossing point. A "No Waiting at Any Time" parking restriction (double yellow line) is therefore proposed on the north side of Well Close Square to alleviate these concerns. It is anticipated the introduction of the restriction will improve road safety by removing obstruction at the crossing point and improving visibility.

I am therefore writing in accordance with Regulation 5 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 (as amended) to formally ask for your comments on the proposed introduction of a "No Waiting at Any Time" parking restriction on Well Close Square, as shown the attached plan.

The County Council is seeking your views on the proposals and a freepost response form is attached to facilitate the consultation process. It should be stressed that this is a genuine consultation and that comments received will be carefully considered.


