

RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY CORPORATE DIRECTOR ACTING DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING: PAUL JONES

PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF VARIOUS SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS – U6513 NORHAM ROAD, ASHINGTON

Purpose of report:

To consider proposed safety improvements at Norham Road, Ashington, including footpath widening, extension of one way system, extension of 20mph Speed Limit, and amendments to parking restrictions, which will be introduced as part of the forthcoming resurfacing works.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that the safety improvements are introduced as proposed as the measures will significantly improve road safety in the area.

Key issues

- Scheme includes footpath widening which will significantly improve road safety for children and parents attending St Aidan's First School and The Northumberland C of E Academy's James Knott Campus.
- Scheme being funded by LTP and will be introduced as part of a scheduled resurfacing scheme.
- 3) The scheme will assist in improving road safety in the area.
- 4) Scheme has the support of Councillor Brian Gallacher.
- 5) Scheme has the support of the aforementioned local schools.
- 6) Residents of Newbiggin Road have reported incidents of indiscriminate parking. This scheme will assist in resolving these issues because the footpath widening should encourage walking to school.

PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF VARIOUS SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS – NORHAM ROAD, ASHINGTON

BACKGROUND

- Concerns have been raised by Councillor Gallacher, St Aidans First School, The Northumberland Church of England Academy's James Knott Campus and local residents about road safety on Norham Road in Ashington.
- 2) Because Norham Road is due to be resurfaced during the school summer holidays, potential safety improvements have been investigated. It is proposed that these are introduced at the same time on the grounds of efficiency. Plans of the proposed scheme are attached as Appendix 1.
- 3) Of primary concern is the narrow footpath on the western side of Norham Road which, despite leading from the existing school crossing patrol site, is difficult to negotiate safely. This will be widened to 1.5 metres where necessary to ensure that the route to the schools is significantly improved.
- 4) The footpath widening aspect of the scheme should encourage parents to walk their children to school by making use of the nearby car parks, and using the existing School Crossing Patrol to gain access to Norham Road. This should also be of benefit to residents of Newbiggin Road who have reported incidents of inconsiderate parking in the back lane at school start and finish times.
- 5) In order for the footpath widening to be introduced, it will no longer be possible to exit Norham Road onto Newbiggin Road, therefore the existing one way entry system will commence at the Norham Road / Newbiggin Road junction rather than north of Norham Road / Newbiggin Road Back Lane junction. This means that any affected residents of Newbiggin Road will have to exit their back lane via North Seaton Road.
- 6) The existing 20mph zone will be extended, it will now commence at the Norham Road / Newbiggin Road junction, to further improve road safety in the area by reducing vehicular speeds.
- 7) Two sets of additional parking restrictions are proposed as follows to allow the safe passage of vehicles throughout Norham Road, notably where the footpath has been widened:-
 - No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions (Double yellow lines) on the eastern side of Norham Road from its junction with Newbiggin Road to its junction with Newbiggin Road Back Lane.
 - No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions (Double Yellow Lines) on the eastern side of Norham Road from its junction with Newbiggin Road Back Lane to a point 15 metres north of its junction with Newbiggin Road Back Lane.

8) Additionally, the existing bus stand, which is only used for school buses, is too large for current use; this will be reduced in length, and replaced with No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions (Double Yellow Lines). This has been discussed with the Council's Passenger Transport Operations Manager who supports the proposal.

CONSULTATION

9) Bearing in mind the ongoing road safety issues in relation to schools located on Norham Road, and the fact that these proposals will significantly improve road safety in the area, the scheme will be introduced without any formal consultation, although an information letter has been sent to all affected residents of Norham Road and Newbiggin Road. A copy of this letter together with a plan of the restrictions to be imposed is attached as Appendix 1.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 10)From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concerns raised in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. However, because this scheme will significantly improve road safety in the area it is recommended that all safety improvements are introduced as proposed.
- 11)The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.

Introduction of Various Safety Improvements Norham Road, Ashington

Concerns have been raised by Councillor Gallacher, St Aidans First School, The Northumberland Church of England Academy's James Knott Campus and local residents about road safety on Norham Road in Ashington.

I am writing to inform you that in order to alieviate these concerns, because Norham Road is due to be resurfaced during the school summer holidays, the introduction of potential safety improvements have been investigated. It is proposed that these improvements are introduced at the same time on the grounds of efficiency.

Of primary concern is the narrow footpath on the western side of Norham Road which despite leading from the existing school crossing patrol site is difficult to negotiate safely. This will be widened to 1.5 metres where necessary to ensure that the route to school is significantly improved.

The footpath widening aspect of the scheme should encourage parents to walk their children to school by making use of the nearby car parks, and using the existing School Crossing Patrol to gain access to Norham Road. This should also be of benefit to residents of Newbiggin Road who have reported incidents of inconsiderate parking in the back lane at school start and finish

In order for the footpath widening to be introduced, it will no longer be possible to exit Norham Road onto Newbiggin Road, therefore the existing one way entry system will commence at the Norham Road / Newbiggin Road junction rather than north of Norham Road / Newbiggin Road Back Lane junction.  No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions (Double Yellow Lines) on the eastern side of Norham Road from its junction with Newbiggin Road Back Lane to a point 15 metres north of its junction with Newbiggin Road Back Lane.

Additionally, the existing bus stand is too large for current use, this will be reduced in length, and replaced with No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions (Double Yellow Lines).
