RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING

PROPOSED ONE WAY SYSTEM, WALTON DRIVE, GUIDE POST

Purpose of Report

To consider the results of the public consultation exercise, regarding the proposed introduction of a One Way System in Walton Drive, Guide Post.

Recommendations

It is recommended that in view of the consultation exercise, a one way system should be introduced, however, taking into account feedback received, the point of entry should be via Hillcrest Avenue rather than Ashington Drive.

Link to Corporate Plan

This report is relevant to the 'Stronger Communities and Families' priority included in the NCC Corporate Plan 2013-2017.

Key Issues

- 1) Scheme being funded by LTP
- 2) The scheme will assist in improving road safety in the area.
- 3) Scheme supported by Councillor Ledger.

Background

1) Concerns have been raised by residents about road safety in Walton Drive in Guide Post. This is a result of limited parking in the area which is causing traffic congestion. Councillor Ledger has also been made aware of this matter and has requested that officers consult residents on a proposed One Way System in order to alleviate these concerns. 2) These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise that involved the delivery of a consultation letter to 49 households and approximately 30 statutory consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).

Consultation

3) The consultation exercise ended on 11th July 2016, and responses were received from 21 consultees, with 17 in favour and 2 against the proposals. Only two statutory consultees responded (North East Ambulance Service and Cycling UK) neither expressed a preference. A summary of these responses is attached as Appendix B.

In Favour

- 4) Whilst indicating their support to the proposed scheme, the following comments were made:-
 - Scheme is long over due, however should be entered via Hillcrest Avenue.
 - Traffic calming measures should be provided.
 - Parking provision is the main concern. Verge hardening should be considered, or parking bays marked out on Walton Drive.
- 5) In response to these comments:-
 - Walton Drive is already part of a recently introduced 20mph speed limit, however, a request for physical traffic calming measures will be added to our Directory of Requests Database for consideration in future Local Transport Plan Programmes.
 - Concerns regarding limited parking are sympathised with, the reality is when these properties were built car ownership was not as it is today. Verge hardening and / or the marking out of parking bays may not result in a significant improvement to the current situation, nevertheless these requests will be added to our Directory of Request Database for consideration in future LTP programmes.

Objections

6) One of of the objections provided a comment. This related to the proposed direction of the one way system. This has been resolved.

Recommendations

7) From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concerns raised in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. The results of the consultation exercise show that the majority of residents who responded support the proposals. It is therefore recommended that the one way system is introduced. However, taking into account feedback received, the point of entry should be via Hillcrest Avenue rather than Ashington Drive.

8) The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.

Proposed One Way System in Walton Drive, Guide Post

Concerns have been raised by residents about road safety at Walton Drive in Guide Post. This is a result of limited parking in the area which is causing traffic congestion. The County Council is seeking your views on the proposals and a freepost response form is attached to facilitate the consultation process. It should be stressed that this is a genuine consultation and that comments received will be carefully considered.


