CRAMLINGTON TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT IMPROVEMENTS

Purpose of Report

To consider the proposed introduction of additional parking restrictions at strategic locations throughout Cramlington as part of an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the following restrictions are introduced as an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order following requests made by Cramlington Town Council and Local County Councillors:-

- Introduce No Waiting (double yellow line) on Forum Way and Dudley Lane
- Introduce No Waiting (double yellow line) and Disabled Blue Badge Holder Bays on Smithy Square
- Introduce No Loading (double yellow line with kerb blips) on Dudley Lane and School Access Road and West Farm Court
- Introduce Time Limited Waiting Bays Monday Friday 8am 5pm
 20 mins, No return within 1 hour on School Access Road
- Introduce Time Limited Waiting Bays Monday Saturday 8am 5pm 3 hours, No return within 4 hours on Church Street

CRAMLINGTON TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT IMPROVEMENTS

Background

- Council Officers have been working with Cramlington Town Council and Local County Councillors to introduce a number of parking restrictions, following the submission of a petition to South East Area Committee in March 2017. The petition claimed the Cramlington Village was suffering from non residential and commercial parking in the Old Village of Cramlington.
- The issues raised in the petition have been discussed with Cramlington Town Council, Local County Councillors and NCC Officers. As well as those highlighted in the petition, further locations where indiscriminate parking is a problem were identified, notably at Cramlington Learning Village.
- 3. Cramlington Town Council have been working proactively with the Council to support additional Traffic Regulation Orders and reduce antisocial behavior. Following concerns regarding dog fouling, littering and inconsiderate parking within Cramlington, they have have entered into an agreement with the Council to fund a Civil Enforcement Officer who has the powers to enforce all three elements of anti social behaviour mentioned.
- 4. There is a high demand for parking at Manor Walks Shopping Centre and surrounding outlets and facilities in Cramlington Village. This is due to the lack of available parking places for visitors and workers during busy periods resulting in any unrestricted parking spaces being utilised when there are no parking places available.
- 5. There is a high demand for parking around Cramlington Learning Village and Sporting Club due to the popularity of facilities offered by the Sporting Club. There is a car park within the grounds which can be utilized by both the School and Sporting Club, but quite often visitors choose to park on the highway nearer the facilities, even when there is space available in the car park.
- 6. Further to the above, a set of proposed experimental parking restrictions have been agreed with Local County Councillors and Cramlington Town Council, for a period of 12 months with feedback being welcomed until 1st March 2019. This will allow a decision to be made on the future of the scheme before the experimental period expires. Plan showing the proposed experimental parking restrictions are attached as Appendix A.
