PROPOSED 'NO WAITING AT ANY TIME' PARKING RESTRICTION, PORT OF BERWICK ENTRANCE, DOCK ROAD, TWEEDMOUTH.

### **Purpose of Report**

To consider a proposal to provide a 'No Waiting at Any Time' parking restriction (double yellow lines) either side of the entrance to the Port of Berwick on Dock Road, to facilitate safe HGV access.

#### **Key Issues**


- 1. The County Council has received concerns from the Harbour Master at Berwick about safe HGV access to the port.

#### **Background**

- 1. The County Council has received concerns from the Harbour Master at Berwick about safe HGV access to the port.
- Cars parked close to the entrance gates can often prevent access which affects port operations as HGVs often find it difficult or even impossible to enter or exit. The picture below shows a view looking south along Dock Road with the port entrance gates on the left.



3. Following discussion with the Harbour Master it is proposed to provide double yellow lines around each side of the port entrance, extending 10 metres along Dock Road either side, as shown in red on the plan below.



- 4. This mirrors Section 243 of the Highway Code which states that drivers should not park within 10 metres of a junction and will provide sufficient clearance for HGV movements.
- 5. The proposed parking restriction does not directly affect any other properties and parking space is available along the remainder of Dock Road.
- 6. For this reason, and because of the importance of Port operations, it was decided that consultation on the proposal was not necessary. This approach was agreed by the local ward Member.
- 7. It is therefore recommended that the double yellow lines are provided in the interests of safe port operations.
