OFF STREET PARKING IMPROVEMENTS - VARIOUS LOCATION

Purpose of Report

To consider the proposed changes to the off street parking order at various location throughout Northumberland.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the following changes are made to the Northumberland County Council Off Street Parking Places Composite Order 2014:-

- Parade Car Park Introduce short stay parking, 3 hours, no return within 4 hours.
- Greenwell Road (Part A) Car Park Introduce short stay parking, 3 hours, no return within 4 hours.
- Greenwell Road (Part D) Car Park Introduce short stay parking, 3 hours, no return within 4 hours.
- Morpeth Railway Station (South) Car Park Introduce maximum stay restriction - 72 hours, no return within 24 Hours
- Alnmouth Railway Station (Northbound) Car Park Introduce maximum stay restriction - 72 hours, no return within 24 Hours

Key Issues

- The results of detailed survey work and parking studies commissioned by the County Council, along with comprehensive stakeholder engagement activity, have provided a clear evidence base that confirms action is required to address the parking issues in key car parks throughout Northumberland.
- 2. Individual parking action plans have now been developed for each of the four towns that build upon the findings of the consultants' studies and take on-board the views and opinions of the local county councillors, town councils and other key stakeholders to provide a range of actions tailored to help address the specific parking issues in their areas.
- 3. The proposed actions are common measures across the towns and include: conversion of long stay to short stay parking in central town centre locations and introduce a maximum stay where it is regarded vehicle are staying excessive periods of time.
- 4. The proposed conversion of some long to short stay parking spaces seeks to ensure the most efficient use of scarce town centre spaces and to increase the turnover of spaces in order to bring more economic activity to the town centres.
- The proposed introduction of a maximum stay seeks to ensure the most efficient use parking places by providing an increase in the turnover of spaces in order to allow better connections to the Northumberland travel Network.

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Recommendations

- 1. From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concerns raised in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. Bearing in mind the extensive consultation process and the ever increasing demand for parking places throughout Northumberland, it is recommended the proposed changes should be introduced as shown in Appendix A.
- 2. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended an inquiry is not held.

Original Decision Report

Purpose of Addendum

The purpose of the Addendum is to amend the 'Maximum stay 72 hours, No return within 24 hours' to Maximum stay 72 hours, No return within 6 hours' time limit to ensure that enforcement of the time limit can be achieved more effectively.

Background

Following the Delegated Decision Report for 'Off Street Parking Improvements - Various Locations' being signed on the 8th June 2018, The legal notices were prepared and advertised on site and in the local press.

At the Intend Notice Stage of the Legal Notices, Parking Services brought forward concerns regarding enforcement of the 'No return within 24 hours'. I was discussed with Highways Programmes and it was agreed that a minor amendment could be made to the Legal notices to change the parking restriction to Maximum stay 72 hours, No return within 6 hours

Therefore, it is recommended that the Maximum Stay 72 hours, No return within 24 hours is amended to Maximum Stay 72 hours, No return within 6 hours in both Alnmouth Railway Station (Northbound) Car Park and Morpeth Railway Station (South) Car Park
