Proposed Traffic Regulation Order - A697 at Hedgeley Station (north of Powburn) (extension of existing 30mph speed limit restriction) 13 March 2018

Cabinet Member: Glen Sanderson - Environment & Local Services

Purpose of Report

This report sets out the background to the implementation of the 30mph speed limit extension at Powburn which was a Local Safety Scheme included in the Local Transport Programme (LTP) Programme 2017/2018.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Experimental Order is implemented on a permanent basis.

Key Issues

- 1. The existing 30 mph speed limit was extended on 16th December 2016 by introducing an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order for a period of 12 months on the A697 at Hedgeley Station North of Powburn.
- During the period of the experimental order no objections were received.

Background

Concerns have been received for many years about speeding and road safety along the length of the A697. As part of the improvement programme a proposal to extend the 30mph limit to the north of Powburn was included in the LTP programme for 2017/18.

Making an experimental order as a precursor to a permanent order can have material benefits. As well as being a more cost effective and flexible approach (allowing e.g. for immediate feedback and minor changes) than a permanent or temporary order.

The existing 30 mph speed limit was extended on the A697 at Hedgeley Station North of Powburn, using an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order for a period of 12 months, commencing on 16th December 2016. Reducing the speed limit here has also meant introducing a 30 mph speed limit on the adjoining roads where previously a de-restricted limit was in place:

- U1093 Branton junction Hedgeley Crossroads road,
- C82 Hedgeley Crossroads to Eglingham junction road and
- U3062 Powburn junction to Crawley Farm Junction.

During the period of the experimental order no objections were received.

It is therefore proposed to implement the traffic regulation order on a permanent basis with no amendments to the advertised experimental order.

Consultation took place with Hedgeley Parish Council, Local County Councillor Wendy Pattison, the emergency services and relevant statutory consultees.
