PROPOSED 'RED ROUTE', HEXHAM AMBULANCE STATION

Purpose of Report

To consider a proposal to provide a 'Red Route' on the approach to Hexham Ambulance Station in Bridge End Industrial Estate, in order to maintain a clear route for ambulances responding to emergencies.


Key Issues

The Ambulance Service is experiencing problems of access and egress from Hexham Ambulance Station due to parked vehicles.

This is a particular concern in emergencies when ambulances can find the route congested.

Background

- 1. The Ambulance Service is experiencing problems of access and egress from Hexham Ambulance Station due to parked vehicles.
- 2. The ambulance station is located on the U8308 road at Bridge End Industrial Estate and is circled on the plan below.



- 3. As the main access road into the Industrial Estate it is well trafficked, including significant HGV movements.
- 4. Roadside parking often takes place on the access road, including by HGVs, some of which park overnight. This can impede access and egress by ambulances.
- 5. In order to address these issues and provide a clear route for emergency vehicles, statutory consultees were consulted on a proposal to provide a Red Route on the access road.
- 6. Red Routes are clearways which apply to the entire highway width, i.e. verges and footways as well as the carriageway, (standard clearways only apply to the carriageway). No vehicle is permitted to stop for any purpose, except in an emergency. Loading and unloading is not permitted. Vehicles displaying a blue badge are permitted to stop to pick up or drop off a disabled person but are not permitted to park.
- 7. A Red Route is marked with double red lines. Signs are also provided on each side of the road, as shown below:





- 8. Given the need to ensure access for ambulances responding to an emergency, a red route is considered preferable to double yellow lines which allow a certain amount of loading, and parking by blue badge holders.
- 9. No responses were received to the consultation, however, the Ambulance Service and the local ward member support the proposal.
- 10. The neighbouring businesses have their own parking areas and sufficient onhighway parking is available nearby, including to the north of the ambulance station access.
- 11. It is therefore recommended that the proposed Red Route Clearway is implemented.


