Proposed 40 MPH Speed Limit Restriction Swarland Village

Cabinet Member: Councillor John Riddle

Purpose of Report

This report sets out the background to the proposed implementation of 40 MPH speed limit restriction to Swarland Village in the area surrounding Swarland Primary School.

Recommendations

It is recommended the changes to the speed limit in Swarland Village adjacent to Swarland Primary School be introduced.

Key Issues

- A reduction to the speed limit in the area surrounding Swarland Primary School is proposed along with other measures, in line with the County Council's current road safety policy.
- This location would benefit from reduced vehicle speeds in the vicinity of Swarland Primary School where Vulnerable Road Users (VRUs) are present.

Background

Introduction of 40 MPH Speed Restriction U3049 Learnington Lane on the approach to Swarland Primary School

The introduction of the speed limit changes to the U3049 on the approach to Swarland Primary School forms part of the 2021/22 Local Transport Plan.

This is part of the County Council's road safety initiative to introduce reduced speed limits adjacent to all schools in Northumberland provided it is feasible to do so. Anecdotal evidence suggests that measures of this kind adjacent to schools provide a safer environment for all road users.

There is currently a 30 MPH Speed Restriction in the village of Swarland and adjacent to the Swarland Primary School. This scheme provides additional road safety considerations including:

- A 40 MPH Speed Restriction on the approach to Swarland Village (currently the speed limit is the National Speed Limit of 60 MPH), which provides a "buffer".
- Associated road makings and physical bollards adjacent to the school to provide additional awareness to road users.
- In addition to a reduction in the speed limit, a "flashing" School Zone sign (as detailed below) will be position on the eastbound approach to the school. This is an advisory speed limit sign which provides an effective additional physical notification to road users.



(At this location given the layout it was not considered appropriate to provide a permanent 20mph limit, with concerns that vehicles travelling at 20mph outside normal school hours could be overtaken by vehicles travelling in excess of that speed causing a road safety problem. The above proposals were felt more appropriate and were discussed and agreed with the relevant stakeholders).

NCC Officers have worked closely with County Councillor Trevor Thorne, Newton-on-the-Moor and Swarland Parish Council and Swarland Primary School on this scheme.

Local canvassing of the scheme was undertaken by the County Councillor and via local forums

Northumbria Police, other emergency services and relevant statutory consultees will be notified of these amendments as part of the process for making the permanent Orders.


