# PROPOSED PARKING RESTRICTIONS, PLESSEY ROAD, BLYTH (23<sup>rd</sup> AVE and EAST DRIVE JUNCTIONS)

Cabinet Member: Councillor John Riddle

#### Purpose of Report

To consider a proposal to provide 'No Waiting at Any Time' parking restrictions (double yellow lines) at the junctions of 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and East Drive with Plessey Road in Blyth.

#### Recommendations

It is recommended that the proposed parking restrictions are implemented.

#### **Key Issues**

- The County Council has received concerns via the local Ward Member about traffic safety at the junctions of 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and East Drive with Plessey Road in Blyth.
- Parking currently takes place at the junctions which blocks sightlines for traffic entering and exiting and forces vehicles to 'edge out' into the carriageway, leading to conflict with oncoming traffic.

#### Background

- 1. The B1503 Plessey Road is one of the main routes through Blyth and is therefore subject to a significant amount of traffic.
- 2. The junctions of 23<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and East Drive with Plessey Road are in close proximity and are close to a petrol filling station and van hire business. The location is shown below.



- 3. Parking takes place at both junctions, on both Plessey Road and the side roads. Parked vehicles block sightlines for vehicles entering and exiting the side roads, leading to conflict with oncoming traffic.
- 4. In order to address this, double yellow lines are proposed to keep the junctions clear of parked cars. It is also proposed to extend the 'Give Way' road markings at the side roads one metre into Plessey Road to further improve visibility. Plessey Road is 8.2 metres wide at this point so there is sufficient carriageway width available to achieve this.
- 5. Residents and Statutory Consultees were consulted on this proposal. Only two responses were received. One was from the County Councils Civil Enforcement Staff who agreed that the issue requires addressing and therefore supported the proposal.
- 6. The other was from the local van hire business based at the filling station who had concerns over the effect of the proposed double yellow lines on customer parking, and the potential for this to be displaced further into the side roads, with consequent impact on local residents.

#### **Delegated decisions**

- 7. Following discussions with the van hire business and the local ward member, it was agreed that if the double yellow lines in the side roads extended a maximum of 12 metres from the Give Way line, this will provide the necessary junction protection whilst still allowing customers to park close to the business and reduce the likelihood of parking being displaced further into the residential area.
- 8. It is therefore recommended that the proposed parking restrictions, as shown in Appendix A, are implemented.
