### PROPOSED 30mph SPEED LIMIT, KIRKWHELPINGTON

#### **Purpose of Report**

To consider a proposal to implement a 30mph speed limit in Kirkwhelpington.

#### Recommendations

It is recommended that the proposed 30mph speed limit should be implemented.



#### **Key Issues**

- Kirkwhelpington does not currently have a speed limit, so the default national speed limit applies.
- Kirkwhelpington Parish Council have requested that a 30mph speed limit be provided, as is the norm for most villages.

#### Background

- 1. The village of Kirkwhelpington does not currently have a reduced speed limit and is therefore subject to the national speed limit of 60mph.
- 2. There is some street lighting provision, but this is limited and is not sufficient to automatically lead to a default 30mph speed limit.
- 3. Although average speeds within the village are below 30mph, the lack of terminal signs means that motorists entering the village are not clearly informed that they are entering an area where low speeds are appropriate.
- 4. Guidance set out in "Setting Local Speed Limits" (DfT 2013, Revised 2024), states that 30mph speed limits should be the norm in villages. It goes on to state that the minimum criteria for what constitutes a village should be a minimum of 20 houses and a road length of 600 metres. These criteria are exceeded in kirkwhelpington.
- 5. Statutory consultees were therefore consulted on a proposal to provide a 30mph speed limit, as shown on the plan below:



6. Only one response was received, a standard response from the North East Ambulance Service, however, the local ward Member and Kirkwhelpington Parish Council have confirmed their support for the proposal.

7. It is therefore recommended that the proposed 30mph speed limit should be implemented.
