PROPOSED 20mph SPEED LIMIT, SOUTHFIELD GARDENS, CRAMLINGTON
Cabinet Member: Councillor John Riddle

Purpose of Report

To consider a proposal to introduce a 20mph speed limit in Southfield Gardens in Cramlington.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the proposed 20mph speed limit is implemented.

Link to Corporate Plan

Key Issues

- A 20mph speed limit in Southfield Gardens was submitted as a priority for the Local Transport Plan Programme by the local Ward Member.
- Speed data shows that average speeds in the estate are appropriate for a signed-only 20mph speed limit.

Background

- Southfield Gardens is a small residential estate of approximately 112 dwellings located adjacent to Cramlington Learning Village with which it shares an access from Dudley Lane.
- 2. The local Ward Member submitted the implementation of a 20mph speed limit in the estate as a priority for the Local Transport Plan Programme.
- 3. Guidance set out in "Setting Local Speed Limits" (DfT 2013), states that "signed-only 20mph speed limits are appropriate for areas where vehicle speeds are already low. This may, for example, be on roads that are very narrow, through engineering or on-road car parking. If the mean speed is already at or below 24mph on a road, introducing a 20mph limit through signing alone is likely to lead to general compliance with the new speed limit."
- 4. Speed data shows that the average speed in Southfield Gardens is 13.15mph. This is below the suggested threshold of 24mph, suggesting that a 20mph speed limit is likely to be complied with and there will be no disadvantage to motorists. The new limit will, however, strengthen the message to road users that this is an area where they are likely to encounter people on foot, including children.
- 5. The area subject to the proposed 20mph speed limit is shown in the diagram below. It includes the access road to Cramlington Learning Village which is in line with the Councils policy of introducing 20mph speed limits at schools wherever possible.



- 6. Statutory consultees were consulted on the proposal. No responses were received; however, the local Ward Member has confirmed support for the proposal.
- 7. It is therefore recommended that the proposed 20mph speed limit should be implemented.
