Proposed Extension to No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions, Brockwell Centre Access, Cramlington

15th February 2018

Purpose of Report

To consider the results of the public consultation exercise, regarding proposed extension of a "No Waiting At Any Time", restriction on the U9555 Brockwell Centre, Cramlington.

Recommendations

It is recommended that the following restrictions are introduced on U9555 Brockwell Centre, Cramlington.: No Waiting At Any Time (double yellow lines).

Key Issues

- 1. This area has been the subject of traffic safety concerns over a period of time i.e. obstruction of the highway, raising concerns with businesses, road users, local County Councillor and Town Council.
- 2. The Scheme is funded and supported by Councillor Wayne Daley.

Background

- 1. Safety concerns have been identified to Councillor Daley by business owners on a number of occasions with regard to obstruction of the highway adjacent to the car park at the Brockwell Retail Centre.
- 2. It is proposed to extend the existing no waiting at any time restriction in this area.
- 3. The final scheme includes the provision of three bollards installed in head of the turning area to prevent indiscriminate parking. This predated the consultation and was to be carried out on safety grounds.
- 4. This would help improve traffic safety for the businesses and road users of Brockwell Centre, Cramlington.

Consultation

- 1. These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise, conducted on the 22nd November 2016. This involved the delivery of a consultation letter to 12 properties and 25 statutory consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).
- 2. The consultation exercise ended on 13th December 2016 and responses were received from 2 consultees, with 1 in favour, 0 against and 1 neither for nor against the proposal. A summary of the responses is attached as Appendix B.
- 3. Councillor Daley was notified of the results of the consultation.

Recommendations

- It is recommended to extend the existing "No Waiting At Any Time", restriction on U9555 Brockwell Centre, Cramlington. As detailed in Appendix A
- 2. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.

Proposed Addition to 'No Waiting at Any Time' Parking Restrictions, Brockwell Centre Access, Cramlington


I would urge you to take the opportunity to comment on this important matter as any decision taken will be based upon the responses received from residents who take time to return the consultation form.
