RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING DELIVERY

EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER INTRODUCTION OF PARKING RESTRICTIONS CENTRAL PRIMARY LOWER SCHOOL

Purpose of Report

To consider the introduction of parking restrictions around Central Primary Lower School in Ashington, which aim to improve road safety for children, parents, grandparents and carers, as well as staff attending the school.

Recommendations

In order to improve road safety at Central Primary Lower School, it is recommended that the following parking restrictions are introduced:-

- School Keep Clear Markings (No Stopping Monday Friday, 8am –
 5pm), will be introduced on Milburn Road and Second Avenue
- No Loading Parking Restriction (double yellow lines with kerb 'blips') will be introduced on Second Avenue

Link to Corporate Plan

This report is relevant to the 'Stronger Communities and Families' priority included in the NCC Corporate Plan 2013-2017.

Key Issues

- We have been aware of issues at this school for a number of years, however, since became a primary school, with more children now attending, these concerns have increased.
- 2) Restrictions should improve road safety around the school
- 3) Scheme being funded by 2017/18 LTP
- 4) Scheme supported by Central Primary Lower School, County Councillor Wilson, Ashington Town Council and the Police
- 5) Parking restrictions to be introduced using Experimental Traffic Regulation Order which will allow effective monitoring of the restrictions imposed by inviting comments throughout the duration of the Order. This will enable us to amend or introduce additional measures as deemed necessary.

6) Scheme will have minimal effect on residents, however they have been notified of our intentions to introduce restrictions.

Background

- We have been aware of issues at this school for a number of years, however, since became a primary school, with more children now attending, these concerns have increased.
- 2) The matter has been raised by various parties including the school, County Councillor Wilson, local police and residents. Particular concerns have been raised about inconsiderate parking at both entrances to the school (Milburn Road and Second Avenue).
- Inconsiderate parking at school start and finish times is a potential road safety risk to everyone attending the school, as well as other road users.
- 4) Council Officers have held meetings with representatives of both the School and the Police as well as local residents with the aim of resolving these safety concerns.
- 5) In order to alleviate these concerns the following parking restrictions are to be introduced:-
 - School Keep Clear Road Markings (No Stopping Monday Friday 8am – 5pm on Milburn Road and Second Avenue
 - No Loading Parking Restriction (double yellow lines with kerb 'blips') on Second Avenue
- 6) Bearing in mind the ongoing road safety concerns issues in relation to this school, and the fact that the additional restrictions are required to try and improve road safety, the restrictions will be introduced without any formal consultation. However an information letter has been sent to affected residents in the area. A copy of this letter together with a plan of the restrictions to be imposed is attached as Appendix A.

Recommendations

7) From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concerns raised in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. While the proposals are supported by Central Primary Lower School, Councillor Wilson, Ashington Town Council and local police, because the parking restrictions are being introduced without any formal consultation with any affected residents it is recommended that they are introduced using an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order. This will be in place for a period of 12 months and

will allow us to monitor the effectiveness of the restrictions imposed, allowing us to introduce alternative restrictions in the area if there was an issue. Feedback is therefore requested throughout the duration of the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order to assist us in making an informed decision at the end of this experiment.

8) The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.

Introduction of New Parking Restrictions at Central Primary Lower School, Ashington

Concerns have been raised by Central Primary Lower School, County Councillor Wilson, local police and residents about road safety as a result of inconsiderate parking at both entrances to the school (Milburn Road and Second Avenue).
