RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY CORPORATE DIRECTOR DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING: PAUL JONES

PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT HEXHAM BUS STATION AND SURROUNDING AREA

Purpose of report:

To consider the results of the public consultation exercise, regarding the proposed introduction of parking restrictions at Hexham Bus Station and the surrounding area.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that in view of the consultation exercise, the proposed parking restrictions are introduced.

Key issues

- 1) Construction of new bus station on Corbridge Road
- 2) Demand for additional short stay parking without removing any existing parking provision
- 3) Demand for additional Blue Badge Holder Parking Place without removing any existing parking provision

PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT HEXHAM BUS STATION AND SURROUNDING AREA

BACKGROUND

- 1) Due to the construction of the new Hexham Bus Station on Corbridge Road, a review of the current parking restrictions within the surrounding area was necessary. Representatives of the County Council worked together with County Councillor Cath Homer to consider what changes to the parking restrictions should be proposed, which will benefit the town and support infrastructure improvements within the area.
- 2) It was proposed the 'No Waiting 8am 7pm' area on the north side of Priestpopple could be used for additional short stay and disabled parking without removing any parking provision within the town.

CONSULTATION

- 3) These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise that involved delivery of a consultation letter to approximately residents/businesses and approximately 30 statutory consultees, including and emergency services various disabled and associations/organizations. A plan showing the proposals is attached with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).
- 4) The consultation exercise concluded on Tuesday 8th November 2016 and responses were received from 6 consultees with 4 being in favour, and 2 consultees did not indicate a preference. (See Appendix B).

COMMENTS

- 5) One comment received raised concerns regarding the bus lay by on Corbridge Road not having Bus Stop Clearways As a Clearway can be introduced without consultation, or a Traffic Regulation Order, it had already been scheduled in for completion on site and has since been introduced.
- 6) One consultee who agreed with the proposed restrictions, made comment on the effect of the restrictions on the Conservation Area - Care will be taken to ensure any additional signage and road markings are kept to an absolute minimum.
- 7) A business who supported the introduction of the parking restrictions stated the short stay parking should be extended - The No Waiting 8am - 7pm parking restriction that exists to the west of the proposed short stay parking on Priestpopple, was not proposed as short stay parking as there is a need for larger vehicles to load and unload when making deliveries to the local businesses.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8) From the outset, the County Council has endeavoured to respond positively to local concerns raised in this area and it is inevitable that some sections of the community will be dissatisfied with whichever decision is reached. However, the assessment of the results of the consultation exercise highlighted that there were no objections to the proposed parking restrictions. It is therefore recommended the proposed parking restrictions are introduced as proposed.
- 9) The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended an inquiry is not held.


I would urge you to take the opportunity to comment on this important matter as any decision taken will be based upon the responses received from residents who take time to return the consultation form.

		NEITHER	Other Relevant Comments The two departure stands on the south side of the new bus station should have "bus stop clearway" markings in them to prevent vehicles other than buses from using the ay-by stops. The red line shown on drawing HE139339 relates to the removal of the existing single yellow line, but no note is shown to highlight that this will be replaced by the new clearway markings. Consequently, it would appear that waiting vehicles displaced from areas shown by a blue line would be able to wait in the bus lay-bys, which is not the case. Further to Andy's reply, can we add a number of further observations, please? 1. The red line on the drawing does indeed show the removal of the former yellow line from the area now occupied by the new bus station. This has already been done. However, drawings provided by the County showed both a broken white line (effectively delineating the northern edge of the carriageway from the two bus stops). I note that a broken white line has already been painted on the carriageway, but this is not in accordance with drawings shown to us previously by the County. Drawing number RN140062/01/A695/10/03 shows that the broken white line, instead of being straight (as has been painted), has a 'kink' so that it moves slightly further southwards, ie., slightly narrowing the carriageway so as to ensure that there is sufficient room for two 'Bus Stop' cages to be pained as appropriate on the south side of the bus station. I'd be grateful if you could confirm that this is being expedited before the bus station opens. 2 Can I reiterate Andy's note that the bus stops on the south side of the carriageway ought to have bus stop clearway markings, and add that these will need to be supported be relevant plates, which ought to be mounted on the 'gallows' poles that believe are going to be installed for the real time displays/ stand plates (ie., not on separate poles, thereby reducing the need for extra street furniture). 3. Unfortunately your drawing does not extend to show the existing east
