# RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY ACTING DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING

Proposed Amendment to Taxi Rank Restrictions, Regent Street, Blyth

#### 8th December 2016

#### **Purpose of Report**

To consider the consultation regarding proposed amendment to the taxi rank time restrictions at Regent Street, Blyth.

#### Recommendations

It is recommended that the taxi rank restrictions are amended at Regent Street Blyth to allow taxis 24 hour access / operation. The current restriction is 'Taxis Only 7pm to 7am'.

#### **Key Issues**

- County Councillor Nisbet has received several requests from taxi
  operators to change the current time restrictions at the taxi rank located
  outside No.38 Regents Street, Blyth (The Blyth and Tyne Hotel), as the
  current restrictions are having an adverse effect on their business
  operations.
- 2. The Scheme is to be funded and supported by Councillor Kath Nisbet.
- Notwithstanding the results received from the public consultation Councillor Nisbet with the support of Councillor Ledger wishes to proceed with the proposal.

#### **Background**

- 1. Local taxi operators have appealed to Councillor Nisbet to allow them to use the taxi rank during the daytime.
- 2. The current traffic regulation order limits the use of the taxi rank to night time only (7pm to 7am).
- 3. This is a well established taxi rank close to the retail hub of Blyth and offers a safe location for picking up fares.

#### Consultation

- 1. These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise, conducted on the 3rd November 2016. This involved the delivery of a consultation letter to 11 business / residential properties and 24 statutory consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).
- 2. The consultation exercise ended on 30th November 2016 and responses were received from three consultees, with none in favour, two against and a further one consultee who were neither for nor against the proposals. A summary of the responses is attached as Appendix B.

#### Comments

- Councillor Nisbet was notified of the results of the consultation and after examining the objections, confirms she wishes to proceed with the scheme.
- Councillor Nisbet and Officers will continue to monitor the area after the order has been amended for any adverse affects, listening to the needs of the residents and business owners in the area and taking forward any information received via the Directory of Requests where appropriate.
- Please note: continuous unloading to business premises is still allowed within the current restrictions on Regent Street i.e. on Double Yellow lines.

#### Recommendations

 It is recommended to amend the traffic regulation order at the taxi rank, Regent Street, Blyth from 7pm to 7am to 24 hours. As detailed in Appendix A. 2. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the canvassing process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.

### Proposed Amendment to Taxi Rank Restrictions, Regent Street, Blyth

County Councillor Nisbet has received several requests from taxi operators to change the current time restrictions at the taxi rank located outside No.38 Regents Street, Blyth (The Blyth and Tyne Hotel), as the current restriction is having an adverse effect on their business operations.

Councillor Nis bet has therefore requested that the following restrictions "Taxis Only 7pm – 7am" be changed to "Taxis Only 24 hours" to alleviate these concerns:

I am therefore writing in accordance with Regulation 5 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1998 (as amended) to formally ask for your comments on the proposal to amend the current time restrictions in force at the taxi rank located outside No.38 Regent Street, Blyth as shown on the attached plan.


