# PROPOSED 20MPH SPEED RESTRICTION WANSBECK MANOR, ASHINGTON

#### 2nd February 2017

#### **Purpose of Report**

To consider the introduction of a 20 mph speed limit, restriction on Wansbeck Manor Estate, Ashington.

#### Recommendations

It is recommended that the following restrictions are introduced on Wansbeck Manor Estate, Ashington: 20 mph Speed Limit.

#### **Key Issues**

- This area has been the subject of traffic safety concerns over a period of time i.e. speeding traffic, raising concerns with residents, local Councillor and Town Council.
- 2. The Scheme is funded and supported by Councillor Mark Purvis

#### **Background**

- 1. Safety concerns have been identified to Councillor Purvis by residents on a number of occasions with regard to speeding traffic in the area.
- 2. It is proposed to introduce a 20mph speed limit restriction in this area
- 3. This would help improve traffic safety for the residents and road users of Wansbeck Manor Estate.

#### Consultation

- 1. A formal consultation did not take place as this proposal is on traffic safety improvement grounds.
- 2. Support for the proposal is provided by both Councillor Purvis and Ashington Town Council. (See Appendix B).
- 3. Statutory consultees have been notified.
- 4. Advertising of the scheme will be carried out via the legal process for the introduction of a new Traffic Regulation Order.

#### Recommendations

- 1. It is recommended to introduce a 20 mph speed limit restriction on Wansbeck Manor Estate, Ashington, as detailed in Appendix A
- 2. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe the involvement of interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.



#### Introduction of 20mph Speed Limit Wansbeck Manor Estate, Ashington

Thank you for your recent correspondence and invitation to comment on the proposal to introduce a 20mph speed restriction on the named streets

From discussion with County Cllr.Mark Purvis the Council is very much aware of the current problem with excessive speed and traffic safety issues on the estate.The Town Council accordingly fully support the scheme proposals to reduce the speed limit from 30mph to 20mph in order to alleviate the current concerns.
