# RECORD OF DECISION TAKEN BY DIRECTOR OF LOCAL SERVICES AND HOUSING DELIVERY

### Proposed No Waiting at Any Time Restrictions, Wellington Street East / Quayside Roundabout, Blyth

### 8th August 2017

#### **Purpose of Report**

To consider the the introduction of a "No Waiting at Any Time" parking restriction at Wellington Street East /Quayside Roundabout, Blyth.

#### Recommendations

I. It is recommended that the following restrictions are introduced on Wellington Street East /Quayside Roundabout, Blyth: No waiting at any time, (double yellow lines).

### **Key Issues**

- This area has been the subject of traffic safety concerns over a period of time i.e. indiscriminate parking, resulting in visibility and pedestrian safety issues, concerns by residents have been raised with their local Councillor.
- 2. The Scheme is funded and supported by County Councillor Eileen Cartie.

### **Background**

- 1. Safety concerns have been identified to Councillor Cartie by residents on a number of occasions with regard to indiscriminate and inconsiderate parking on Wellington Street East..
- 2. It is proposed to introduce no waiting at any time restriction in this area

3. This would help improve traffic safety for the residents, and road users of Wellington Street and The Quayside area, Blyth.

#### Consultation

- 1. These proposals were the subject of a consultation exercise, conducted on the 29th June 2017. This involved the delivery of a consultation letter to 54 properties and 25 statutory consultees, including the emergency services and various disabled and transport associations/organisations. A plan showing the proposals is attached together with a copy of the consultation letter (see Appendix A).
- 2. The consultation exercise ended on 12th July 2017 and responses were received from 3 consultees, with 2 in favour, 0 against and 1 neither for nor against the proposal. A summary of the response is attached as Appendix B.

#### Comments

- 1. Councillor Cartie was notified of the results of the consultation.
- 2. Councillor Cartie confirms she wishes to proceed with the proposal, this will be funded through her allocation in the Member Local Improvements Programme.
- 3. This scheme will be carried out at the same time as a other similar schemes in the Wesleydale Ward, Blyth, which has also been proposed and agreed with Councillor Cartie. Thereby, making a saving in advertising costs for the traffic regulation order and programming.

#### Recommendations

- 1. It is recommended that the proposal as detailed in Appendix A should proceed.
- 2. The Council has the power to hold a public inquiry before making any traffic regulation order. Such an inquiry might enable disputed evidence to be tested under cross-examination and the need for an order to be critically examined by an independent inspector. In this particular case, officers believe that the extensive consultation process and involvement with interested parties, means that such an inquiry is unlikely to bring any fresh information to light and it is therefore recommended that an inquiry is not held.

#### Proposed No Waiting at Any Time Parking Restrictions, Wellington Street East / Quayside Roundabout, Blyth


