- This Order shall come into operation on the 21st November 2016 and may be cited as "The County of Northumberland (Station Road Ashington 20mph Speed Restriction) Order 2016."
 - (2) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
 - (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered article or schedule is a reference to the article or schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- Save as provided in Article 3, this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to proceed at a speed in excess of 20 mph on those lengths of highway detailed in Schedule 1
- Nothing in Articles 1 and 2 shall make it unlawful for a person to drive in excess of the stated speed limit on the length of roads specified in that Article if it is being used for police, fire and rescue or ambulance purposes.
