The Northumberland County Council, in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2), 82(2), 83(2) and 84 and Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby make the following order:

- This Order shall come into operation on the 9<sup>th</sup> April 2018 and may be cited as "The County of Northumberland (Seahouses First School 20 MPH Speed Restriction) Order 2018."
  - (2) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
  - (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered article or schedule is a reference to the article or schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- Save as provided in Article 3, this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to proceed at a speed in excess of 20 mph on those lengths of highway detailed in Schedule 1.
- Nothing in Articles 1 and 2 shall make it unlawful for a person to drive in excess of the stated speed limit on the length of roads specified in that Article if it is being used for police, fire and rescue or ambulance purposes.

# STATEMENT OF THE COUNCIL'S REASONS FOR MAKING THE ORDER

The Order is necessary as part of Northumberland County Council's road safety improvements adjacent to schools, by introducing a 20 MPH limit at Seahouses First School and surrounding area.
