NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 (C14 BOWSDEN 30 MPH SPEED RESTRICTION EXTENSION) ORDER 2020 (TROM 190)

Northumberland County Council, in exercise of their powers under Sections 81 to 84 and Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby make the following Order:

- (1) This Order shall come into operation on the 29th December 2020 and may be cited as "Northumberland County Council (C14 Bowsden 30 MPH Speed Restriction Extension) Order 2020."
 - (2) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
 - (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered article or schedule is a reference to the article or schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 3 and 4, this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to drive a vehicle at a speed in excess of 30 mph on those lengths of highway detailed in Schedule 1.
- Nothing in Articles 1 and 2 shall make it unlawful for a person to drive in excess of 30 mph on the lengths of highway specified in Schedule 1, if it is being used for police, fire and rescue or ambulance purposes.
- 4. Nothing in Articles 1 and 2 shall make it unlawful for a person to drive in excess of 30 mph on the lengths of highway specified in Schedule 1, if the vehicle is used by a member of the special forces and is being driven in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving vehicles at high speeds or for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds.
- 5. This Order will hereby revoke the following Order in Article 1 of "The County Council of Northumberland (Various Towns and Villages in the County of Northumberland) (30 MPH and 40 MPH Speed Restrictions) Order 2001":
 - Bowsden On the C14 (Mattilees-Bowsden Road) from a point approximately 220 metres west of its junction with the B6524 westwards for approximately 1070 metres.
