NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Northumberland County Council (herein referred to as "the Council") have made the above-named Order under the provisions of Section 1 and Section 9 and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act").

The effect of the Order, which will come into force on the 29th March 2021 until 29th March 2022 on an experimental basis and will introduce a Prohibition of Driving except for Access to Off-Street Premises in Craster Village on following lengths of highway:

Exemptions are included as detailed in Section 5 in the Order for

- (1) Access to off-street premise
- (2) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations:
 - buildings, industrial or demolition operations; (a)
 - the removal of any obstruction to traffic; (b)
 - the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of (c) road:
 - (d) for fire and rescue, police, ambulance or special forces purposes;
 - (e) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Communications Act 2003, and

- (3) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose on any other highway, to be used in the service of a local authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
- (4) Local Services Buses as defined in Section 2 of the Transport Act 1985

A copy of the draft Order, together with a map showing the lengths of road involved and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for Proposing to make the Order is available to view or download on the NCC

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made apply to the High Court for that purpose.

During the period that the Order remains in force the Council will consider if it should remain in force permanently. Within the period of six months from the coming into force of the Order, or if the Order is subsequently varied by another Order or modified pursuant to Section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, from the coming into force of that variation or modification (whichever is the latest), any person may object to the making of the Order to continue indefinitely by sending a statement in writing of their objection or representation and the grounds thereof to the undersigned, at the address shown below.
