The effect of the Order, which will come into force on the 3rd February 2025 will be to vary the "Northumberland County Council (Waiting, Loading & Parking Places) (Map Based) Consolidation Order 2024" by introducing new parking restrictions on the following lengths of highways in Wooler:

- 1) 'No Waiting at Any Time' on South Road and The Peth;
- 2) 'Prohibition of stopping on entrance markings' on South Road.

The restrictions can also be viewed in map format, as the maps form part of the map-based schedule to the Order.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made apply to the High Court for that purpose.
