- 2) No Waiting at Any Time on:
  - Commercial Road in Spittal
  - Meadow Lane, Swinhoe Road and The Wynding in Beadnell
  - Front Street, Sea Lane and U3014 Dunstan Square to Embleton Links in Embleton:
  - Queens Road, Victoria Crescent and York Road in Alnwick;
  - Dial Place in Warkworth
  - An extension to the current "No Waiting at Any Time" restriction on Bisley Road, Amble
  - Acklington Road in Amble
  - Front Street, Hall Hill Cottages and Rothbury Road in Longframlington;
- 3) A Disc Parking Zone also known as a disc holders parking place will apply Monday-Saturday between the hours of 8am-6pm, 2 hours maximum stay, with no return within 3 hours, on Bondgate Within, Alnwick.

The restrictions can also be viewed in map format, as the maps form part of the mapbased schedule to the Order. If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made apply to the High Court for that purpose.
