# ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 (A192 MORPETH STOBHILL TO BARMOOR BANK 40 MPH SPEED RESTRICTION) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2017 Ref: TROM\_070

The Northumberland County Council, in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, hereby make the following order:

#### 1. Commencement and Citation

1.1 This Order shall come into operation on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2017, for an experimental period of 12 months and may be cited as the "The County of Northumberland (A192 Morpeth Stobhill to Barmoor Bank 40 MPH Speed Restriction) Experimental Order 2017 (TROM\_070)."

## 2. Interpretation

- 2.1 In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
- 2.1.1 "Council" means Northumberland County Council
- 2.1.2 "The Act" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984
- 2.2 Any reference in this order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent re-enactment.

#### 3. General

- 3.1 The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirements imposed by any Regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
- 3.2 Where an Act of Parliament referred to in this Order or any Regulation, Direction or Order made under it is repealed and new provisions enacted (with or without modifications) new provisions shall be substituted in this Order where relevant.
- 3.3 Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered article or schedule is a reference to the article or schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 3.4 The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament

# 4. Introduction of 40 MPH Speed Restriction

4.1 Save as provided in Article 5, this Order shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit a vehicle to proceed at a speed in excess of 40 mph on those lengths of highway detailed in Schedule 1.

#### 5. Exemptions

5.1 Nothing in Article 4 shall make it unlawful for a person to drive in excess of the stated speed limit on the length of roads specified in that Article if it is being used for police, fire and rescue or ambulance purposes.

# 6. Power to modify or amend this Order

- 6.1 The operation of this Experimental Order or any provision of it may be modified or suspended by the Council's Director of Local Services and Housing if it appears to him essential -
- 6.1.1 In the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic;
- 6.1.2 In the interests of providing suitable and adequate on-street parking facilities, or
- 6.1.3 for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the order runs.
- 6.2 but this power shall be exercised only after consulting the appropriate chief officer of police and giving such public notice as the Secretary of State may direct

#### 7. Revocations

# Introduction of 40 MPH Speed Restriction

(i) A192 between Morpeth Stobhill to Barmoor Bank – a point 287 metres south east of its junction with Stobhill Roundabout (A196) (grid reference 421014 584522) to a point 940 metres north westerly from its junction with C132 (Hepscott)
