ORDER 2020
(TROM_192)**

Northumberland County Council, in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 and Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby make the following Order:

1. (1) This Order shall come into operation on the **** day of ***** 2020 and may be cited as "Northumberland County Council (Mayfair Gardens Fairney Close Fairney Edge Ponteland Prohibition of Driving Except for Access to Off-Street Premises) Order 2020."
- (2) The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or y or under any other enactment.
- (3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.
- (4) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
2. Save as provided in Article 3, no person shall cause any vehicle to enter except for access to off-street premises, those lengths of highway detailed in The Schedule of this Order.
3. Nothing in Article 2 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed along those lengths of highway detailed in the Schedule annexed to this Order so long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (1) Access to off-street premises
 - (2) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations:-
 - (a) buildings, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road;
 - (d) for fire and rescue, police, ambulance or special forces purposes;
 - (e) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for

the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Communications Act 2003, and

- (3) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose on any other highway, to be used in the service of a local authority in the pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Revocations:

1. The Order known as "The County of Northumberland (Mayfair Gardens and Callerton Lane, Ponteland) (No Waiting at Any Time and Prohibition of Driving Except for Access to Off-Street Premises) Order 2008" is hereby revoked in full.
